At the winter meeting the new “ASHRAE” brand was announced. This is part of a makeover in the ASHRAE logo and corporate name. American Society of Heating Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers is now a thing of the past. The new organization name is simply ASHRAE. The logo has also undergone an update, but you have pardon us for several issues as we try and catch up with the new logo.

In a letter published on the web-site President Jarnigan explains that the organization’s role has shifted more towards sustainability and total building design and thus an update in the logo and name was needed. ASHRAE & IAPMO

A Memo of Understanding (MOU) was signed at the winter conference between ASHRAE and the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials. The IAPMO is the organization that writes the Uniform Plumbing and Mechanical codes.

The MOU details ways in “which the two organizations can work together to advance and promote mutual interests in built environment codes and standards.” The memo outlines collaboration in areas of promotion of codes and standards with mutually beneficial positions, co-develop courses and training programs in areas of overlapping interest and expertise, promoting research, and other areas.
